STORYTIME GOAL STATEMENT

In order to help families build early literacy skills, storytimes provide a welcoming, engaging and age-appropriate learning experience that encourages positive interactions between children and caregivers.

STORYTIME COMPONENTS (WHAT)	STORYTIME LENSES (WHY)
Content Presentation Management Messaging	Literacy-Based Welcoming Engaging
<p><i>Components</i> describe our storytime competency areas:</p> <p>Content = selecting storytime materials and developing a storytime plan</p> <p>Presentation = delivering a competent performance, managing time effectively, and arranging the storytime area</p> <p>Management = guiding group behavior and fostering interaction</p> <p>Messaging = delivering five types of messages: welcome, informational, behavior expectations, literacy, and invitation to play</p>	<p><i>Lenses</i> describe our ideal storytime experience:</p> <p>Literacy-Based = research-based, intentional, demonstrative</p> <p>Welcoming = inviting, inclusive, accessible, comfortable, supportive, age-appropriate</p> <p>Engaging = interactive, compelling, dynamic, relational, participatory</p>
