Program Highlights

• Because of demand, two sessions per week: 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Fridays

No registration

No age limits, large groups

Philosophy

All inclusive

• Encourage parents on maternity and paternity leave to get involved as early as possible.

Not segregated (Whole family – holistic approach)

Philosophy (cont.)

• Bonding

Parents learn from each other

• Empower parents to trust themselves. We need to respect, and be as inclusive as possible.

Big Group = Lots of FUN!



Main Focus

- Building early literacy skills through:
 - 1. Rhymes
 - 2. Songs
 - 3. Music
 - 4. Games
 - 5. Stories

Goal

• Fast-paced

• Stimulating language play for parent and child

• FUN!!

Structure

• 6-week themed program (30 minutes)

- Why do I use themes?
 - Decision-making
 - Repetition (important for cognitive development)

Set-up

• Storytime Room or meeting room

Display themed books, rhyme posters

- Books on floor
 - Print awareness, print motivation

Books

- 1 or 2 books per session. 6-8 books per 6-week program
 - One rhyming, one short

Flap books/large books

Flannelboard stories, puppets

Read books with large pictures - big books are great too!





Music, Music, and More Music!

Captures baby's attention

 Exposes baby to sound patterns and rhythm and beat of language

 Play music before and after program, encourage parents to sing!

Rhymes

- 15 rhymes per 6-week program (10 per program)
- Variety of rhymes:
 - Clapping
 - Tickle
 - Interactive
 - Body parts (head, fingers, knee bounces)
 - Lullabies
- Repeat rhymes twice (soft and loud, fast and slow, etc.)

Props

- Musical instruments
 - Egg shakers
 - Bells
 - Sticks
 - Rattles
- Scarves
- Hand and finger puppets
- Parachute / Scarf Canopy



















Props and puppets are great ways to capture babies attention





Six-Week Program Summary


- 15 Rhymes (10 per session)
- 6-8 books
- Music
- Musical instruments: bells, rattles, maracas, tambourine, drum, bell.
- Scarves sheer (Oriental Trading or West Music)
- Parent tips 1-2 tips at each session (The Early Literacy Kit: A handbook and tip cards, & Early Literacy Storytimes by Saroj Ghoting)
- Rhyme sheet handout I've included three rhyme sheet samples for you.

Benefits of Community Partnerships

- Exposes families to area resources
- Education
- Encourages parent participation
- Exposure for local businesses and organizations
- Forming bonds within the community

Parents/caregivers share and develop friendships.






